Dr. Carol Rittner is a Roman Catholic nun, a member of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas. For more than 40 years, she has taught and written about the Holocaust *"in the hope that my efforts will contribute to the efforts of others who also are trying to get people to think about how we relate to Jews and Judaism, to those who are not "us" so that when we are faced with having to help, we do not avert our eyes or turn our backs but reach out and help."*



Dr. Rittner is Distinguished Professor of Holocaust & Genocide Studies Emerita and Dr. Marsha Radicoff Grossman Professor of Holocaust Studies Emerita at Stockton University, New Jersey. She is the author or editor of numerous essays and books about the Holocaust and other genocides. She has lectured around the world, in places as diverse as Israel, South Africa, Australia, Sweden,

Canada, and the USA. Her most recent book is *Holocaust Education Today: Confronting Extremism, Hate, and Mass Atrocity Crimes*. (forthcoming, 2023).
